

European Union Symbols





The European flag symbolises unity and harmony among EU countries. It is blue with 12 golden stars in a circle, because both the number and the shape represent perfection and entirety.



Europe Day is on 9 May. It celebrates peace and unity in Europe. The date marks the anniversary of the historic 'Schuman Declaration' that set out the idea for a new form of political cooperation in Europe, which would make war between European countries unthinkable.

The European anthem is called Ode to Joy. It represents the European ideals of freedom, peace and solidarity.








Q The 8 Goals of the European Union

AND HOW THEY WORK

- The European Council the Heads of State or Government sets out the EU's priorities.
- 2 Based on these, the European Commission proposes new laws.
- 3 The proposals are reviewed and amended, accepted or refused by the European Parliament, together with the Council of ministers. Once they come to an agreement, they approve the laws.
- 4 The European Commission makes sure that all EU countries observe the new EU laws. If not, it can take action against them.

EPLOs

Responsible for implementing institutional communication activities, with the ultimate goal of ensuring that people understand the importance of the European Parliament well enough to engage in the European democratic process

They engage with the population and increase awareness about what the European Parliament is, what it does and what it stands for

EPLOs proactively bring EU news, debates and decisions to media. They monitor inaccuracies and misleading news about the European Parliament, and rebut them



CONFERENCE ON THE FUTURE OF EUROPE


-MULTILINGUAL DIGITAL PLATFORM



4 STEP GUIDE TO MANAGE FAKE NEWS

Use this guide to successfully safeguard against fake news about the EU


STEP 1. ENCOUNTER

Coming across a "news" article that doesn't seem 100% trustworthy



STEP 2. DISCUSS

Discussing it with your peers to see if they have the same or different information on the subject



STEP 3. RESEARCH

Do a background check on the author and research more information from trusted EU platforms on the topic



STEP 4. BECOME INFORMED!

Always use trusted sources and become an informed citizen

TIPS TO FIGHT "FAKENEWS"

WHAT IS "FAKE NEWS"?

- Authentic material used in the wrong context
- Imposter news sites designed to look like others we already know
- Fake news sites
- Fake information
- Manipulated content
- Parody content

HOW DO "FAKE NEWS" SPREAD?

Creators of fake news check verified news sources and use facts from these verified news outlets and layer it with misinformation to confuse and deceive the reader. When confronted by both the fake news and verified news, people tend to discount both the misinformation and the facts. Additionally, most adults use social media to get their news (68.15% use Facebook as a news source according to the CommEUnication survey conducted in 2021)

HOW TO HANDLE "FAKE NEWS"?

1. Think before you share.

Read the entire piece before you decide whether or not to share.

2. Verify an unlikely story.

Investigate the source, website, its mission and contact info.

3. Install a browser extention that identifies stories from websites that produce clickbait, fake news, and other suspect stories.

4. Help debunk fake news.

- Report fake news on Facebook and other platforms
 - 5. Expand your information network to include diverse perspectives from quality sources.

6. Evaluate your news using the IMVAIN Method

- Independent sources are preferable to self-interested sources.
- Multiple sources are preferable to a report based on a single source.
- Sources who Verify or provide verifiable information are preferable to those who merely assert.
- Authoritative and/or Informed sources are preferable to sources who are uninformed or lack authoritative background.
- Named sources are better than anonymous ones.
